Charles H. Hewitt, 76, of (Fairhope) Belle Vernon, went to be with the Lord on Thursday, April 5, 2012 in Jefferson Regional Medical Center. A son of the late Charles and Margaret Sims Hewitt, he was born in Belle Vernon on November 15, 1935. Chuck was a member of the Christian Center Church of Belle Vernon, a board member and vice president of the Belle Vernon Cemetery Association, the F.& A.M. Tri-County Lodge 252, and served as President of the Washington Twp. Senior Citizens at the Center on the Hill. He retired from the Clairton Works of the U.S. Steel Company and was in the U.S. Navy in the Korean War. Chuck was well known by his portrayal of 'Santa' for the past 21 years throughout southwestern Pennsylvania. Survivors include four sons and three daughters-in-law, Charles H.
