Gary R. Leavor, 31, of Rostraver Twp., passed away on Monday, July 27, 2020 in Allegheny General Hospital. A son of John R. and Cathy A. Foor Leavor who survive and reside in Rostraver Twp., he was born in Monongahela on February 12, 1989. A lifelong resident of Rostraver, Gary was a member of the Holy Resurrection Orthodox Church and received the Eagle Scout award in 2006. Gary was part of the online streaming group, The Gamesmen, consisting of an international group of friends streaming videogames and recording podcasts to bring their love for gaming and its joy to viewers around the world. Gary's hobbies included fishing and outdoor activities, various homemade crafts, making salsa, gardening, and engaging in charity drives to aid underserved youth, bring awareness to disability and illness, and raise funds to help those in need. He had been employed by the F.S. Elliott Company in Export for the past two years. In addition to his parents, he is survived by two brothers, Kevin Leavor and Sean Leavor, both of Newport News, VA; numerous aunts, uncles, nieces and nephews; his two dogs, Snow and Buddy; and his three cats, Curi, Possum, and Little Foot. 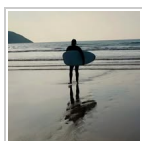
