



Glenn Lawrence Guseman

October 28, 1933 - January 27, 2017

Glenn Lawrence Guseman, 83, of Jefferson Twp., went to be with the Lord on Friday, January 27, 2017 in Mon Valley Hospital. A son of the late George and Evelyn Federer Guseman, he was born in Grindstone on October 28, 1933. Glenn was a member of the First Christian Church of Fayette City, the Tri County Lodge 252 F. & A.M., the Belle Vernon American Legion, Post 659, Fairhope Rod and Gun Club, Belle Vernon Moose, Lodge 209, Naomi Club, Russian Club of Pricedale, Gillespie Slovak Club and the Santa Barbara Club of Newell. He had resided in the Fayette City area for most of his adult life. A U.S. Army veteran of the Korean War, he served in Germany. Glenn was a brakeman for the B & O Railroad from 1954 – 1961, drove buses for TYrailways in Maryland from 1961 – 1969 and then worked for the former Fox Grocery Company, Wetterau and then Supervalu as a tractor trailer / jockey driver from 1971 until his retirement in 2000. An avid Steelers fan and pool player, he also enjoyed hunting and boating on the Monongahela River on the Golden Guse, waterskiing, bingo and camping.
