Glenn Kay Pore, 87, of Belle Vernon, went to be with the Lord on Saturday, October 2, 2021. A son of the late Lewis and Mildred Powell Pore, he was born in Pricedale on January 6, 1934. Glenn attended Lynnwood Lutheran Church and the former Pricedale Union Church. He had been employed as a warehouse manager at the Westinghouse Atomic Plant in West Mifflin, retiring in 1992. Following retirement, he was self employed as an electrician for many years. Glenn was a U.S. Army Veteran of the Korean war and served in White Sands, NM.
