Hugh B. 'Bud' Dunn, Jr., 91 of Greensburg, died Sunday, February 28, 2010 in Redstone Highlands, Greensburg. A son of the late Hugh B. and Hazel Mountsier Dunn, he was born in Belle Vernon on August 15, 1918. Protestant by faith, he was formerly of Belle Vernon where he had lived most of his life.
