Kenneth J.A. 'Whitey' Herron, 75, died Monday, November 19, 2007 at the home of his daughter in Rostraver Twp. A son of the late Charles and Viola Herron, he was born in Long Branch on August 31, 1932. He was a member of the Charleroi American Post 22, currently serving as 1st vice-president, the Legion Pool League and the Charleroi Elks, Lodge 494 where he was honored as the Elk of the Year in 1984, an award given annually to the Elk who demonstrated dedication, thoughtfulness and attitude to Elks and members. A resident of Charleroi since 1964, he had been employed by Page Steel in Monessen, the Allenport Plant of W-P Steel Co. and retired in 1999 from Charleroi Federal Savings Bank. He also served as a Private 1st Class in the U.S. Army, stationed in Korea, from 1953 to 1954.
