Lloyd G. Rabe, Jr., 72, of N. Belle Vernon, peacefully went to be with the Lord Sunday, July 3, 2011 at his home. A son of the late Lloyd G. and Margaret Marsh Rabe, he was born in Carroll Twp. on November 16, 1938. Lloyd attended Calvary Bible Church in N. Charleroi and was a member of the former Sampson Union Church. A resident of N.
