“ It’s been fifteen years and two months since I picked Matthew (E-Dad) up at West Virginia University and drove him cross-country to Missoula, Montana. I was moving to San Diego and I took the long way around to add my good buddy to the journey. Our first stop was Indianapolis, and at the very first bar, Matt reached into his wallet and realized he left his ID with the bank teller in Morgantown. It was a classic road trip move, but this was no catastrophe in his easy-going book. This was an opportunity and he seized it the same way he always did... by making friends with strangers. His new bohemian friends told him the band Phish was playing a show the following day, and so while his ID was getting overnighted to us, we danced and celebrated our post-college lives.

The next stop was Chicago, and after a long night enjoying the Windy City, E-Dad woke up early and was determined to beeline it to his new mountain town. “Missoula,” he said. “Missoula or bust.” This was June 2004 and paper maps were still a thing. We didn’t know how far it was until a shoelace and a scale told us Chicago to Missoula was 1,600 miles, give or take a thread. So... fueled by music, coffee, and beef jerky, E-Dad and I drove 25 straight hours and arrived three days early for his job interview, which I believe he nailed.

As for me, I stayed two nights before I had to be on my way, but I’ll never forget how I felt when I drove away that morning. I remember looking in the rear-view mirror and watching him wave goodbye. He was so happy that day and I couldn’t help but feel sad that he wouldn’t be joining me for the rest of my trip. I remember how I felt then because it’s how I feel now... only it’s much worse. What I’d give for just one more road trip with my good buddy, or at least another game of hockey followed by some beers and bluegrass at the BrewPub. Matthew was such a huge part of my life, and my only hope is he’s somewhere as happy as he was the day I left him in Missoula.
