Nelson E. "Smitty" Smith, 68, of Naomi (Fayette City) went to be with the Lord, with his family by his side, on Wednesday, August 21, 2013, in Mon Valley Hospital. A son of the late Wylie Eugene and Mildred Urch Smith, he was born November 28, 1944, in North Charleroi. Smitty was a lifelong resident of the Mon Valley, and served in the Army during the Vietnam Era. He was an active member of the Fayette City Alliance Church, where he assisted with the youth group, was a member of the Naomi Club, the Fayette City American Legion Post 484, where he was a Past Commander and a member of the Honor Guard, was the First Vice Commander of Fayette County Committee of the American Legion, was the 24th District Deputy of the American Legion and was a 1963 graduate of Frazier High School. Smitty was a truck driver for the majority of his life, being both self employed as well as driving for J.A. Trucking. He was currently a school van driver for the Belle Vernon School District.
