Oliver B. West, Jr., 74, of Dawson, passed away on Monday, June 20, 2022 at Select Specialty Care in Latrobe. A son of the late Oliver B. and Eleanor Gregg West Sr., he was born on February 20, 1948 in N. Charleroi. Formerly of Perryopolis, Oliver had resided in Dawson for 47 years and was a member of the VFW Perryopolis Post 7023 and the Slovak Club in Connellsville. He worked at Combustion Engineering from 1970 to 1987 and Kenametal in Irwin from 1990 till he retired after 25 years in 2015. Oliver was an avid pool player for many years and served in the U.S. Army, Vietnam where he was a Purple Heart recipient.
