



## Raymond Moody

January 15, 1946 - August 29, 2007

Raymond Moody, Jr., 61, of N. Belle Vernon died Wednesday, August 29, 2007 in Jefferson Regional Medical Center. A son of the late Raymond and Evelyn Woods Moody, he was born in N.
