

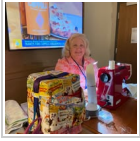


Samuel Suzich

Samuel Suzich, 86, of Grantsville, MD, formerly of Roscoe, passed away on Wednesday, September 2, 2020. A son the late Mike and Molly Bjelosh Suzich, he was born in Roscoe on July 11, 1934. He graduated from Charleroi High School in 1952 and from the University of Pittsburgh in 1963 with a Bachelor's in electrical engineering.
